

# Interested in integrating LARC provision at your community health practice?

## Check out the **getLARC** Post-Residency Program

The **getLARC** Post-Residency Program provides grant funding to support the integration of LARC services into community health centers (CHCs) or federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) by recent family medicine graduates.

### You may be eligible to apply for grant-funding if you are or soon to be:

- ✓ A recent family medicine graduate
- ✓ Entering practice at a community health center (CHC) or federally qualified health center (FQHC) with limited or no LARC provision

### What does the grant support include?

- 10% salary support (protected time) for the entering graduate to develop protocols and resolve logistical barriers to implementing LARC services
- Initial supply of grant-funded LARC devices and one set of instruments
- Technical assistance for enhancing LARC services at the CHC/FQHC
- Ongoing evaluation to assess LARC provision

### What are the expectations of the participating CHC/FQHC site?

- **getLARC** Coordinator will develop and implement clinic protocols and systems to enhance LARC services and improve patient access to LARC services at the site
- Track use of LARC devices and provide monthly reports on device use
- Participate in program evaluation efforts, such as completing surveys and possible qualitative interviews

### What are the goals of the Post-Residency Program?

This is a program to help us better understand the factors necessary to integrate LARC services into CHCs/FQHCs. By reducing the initial cost barrier to clinics through grant-funded devices, offering protected time for a provider (“LARC champion”) to address logistical barriers within the clinic, and by providing technical assistance in the form of regular check-ins with the **getLARC** Coordinator, we hope to assist clinics with integrating LARC provision into their services in a way that is sustainable after the end of the funding.

This is a pilot program and we are particularly interested in the barriers and supports encountered by the **getLARC** Coordinator and by others in the clinic. For this reason, we plan to evaluate this program so that we can gain a better understanding of these questions.
